Mexican Food Cart at the Manson Red Apple Market

If you're in a hurry or don't feel like cooking or going out for dinner, try the Mexican cart in the Red Apple parking lot. They have great traditional burritos and generous portions. There's a reason that someone is almost always over there ordering food to go. It's definitely not fancy restaurant food, but the price is right and if you compare the homemade Mexican food to fast food fare like McDonald's or Taco Bell, it's way better. I don't know if it's the same everywhere, but we have a lot of food carts in the Portland area; some are very good, many are mediocre, and some are not good at all. I would put the Manson Mexican cart somewhere between mediocre and very good. Up until last fall I was always a little squeamish about trying it out – food carts don't have the best reputation for cleanliness. I would rate cleanliness in the mediocre range for this cart – the rating is off the high end of the chart compared to street vendors in Mexico. If you can deal with this in your search for a great burrito, the Manson Mexican cart is worth a try. -Larry
